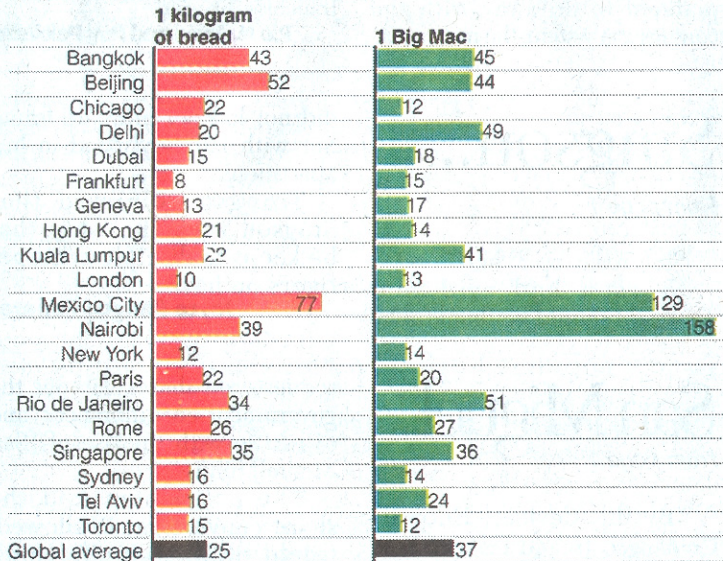

Local Wage Differences Show Relative Cost of Bread, Big Mac,

According to a UBS study of relative purchasing power in cities around the world, a wage-earner in Nairobi would have to work for more than 2 1/2 hours to pay for a McDonald's Big Mac sandwich. That's more than 10 times longer than for those in New York and Sydney, who would need to work only 14 minutes.
